PROJECT OVERVIEW:

Funding supported the capital campaign to repair and restore a historic community asset in Garfield Park – the fountains in the Sunken Garden. Garfield Park is Indianapolis' oldest park and is home to the Conservatory and Sunken Garden. The Sunken Garden is a 3-acre, fully enclosed, Europeanstyle formal garden, with three fountains as the centerpieces. Surrounded by paved brick walkways, limestone benches and glorious landscaping, this vibrant community asset has been an anchor for Garfield Park since 1916. Architect George E. Kessler envisioned the fountains and Sunken Garden as a way to enhance the community, and this project to repair and replace them, permanently, is a top priority for the Friends of Garfield Park.
